36AD	Conversion on the road to Damascus (Acts 9.1-9)
37-39AD	Visit to Arabia, then 3 years in Damascus (Gal 1.15-17)
39AD	Escape from Damascus: first visit to Jerusalem (Acts 9.23-26)
39-43AD	In Tarsus and the regions of Syria and Cilicia for 4 to 5 years
44AD	A year in Antioch with Barnabus (Acts 11.26)
45AD	Second visit to Jerusalem bearing financial help (Acts 11.30)
45-47AD	First missionary journey, lasting 2 years (Acts 12.24-14.28)
48-49AD	Stayed "a long time" – 2 years – in Antioch (Acts 14.28)
50AD	Third visit to Jerusalem for the council (Acts 15.1-35)
51-54AD	Second missionary journey, lasting 3 years (Acts 15.36-18.22)

54AD	Fourth visit to Jerusalem at end of 2 nd journey (Acts 18.22)

2nd Corinthians written in Macedonia, Autumn of 57AD
Galatians written at Corinth, in the Winter of 57AD
Romans written at Corinth, in the Spring of 58AD

58AD	Fifth visit to Jerusalem and arrest in the Temple (Acts 21.17-27)
59-60AD	Imprisonment at Caesarea for 2 years (Acts 24.23-27)
60-61AD	Journey to Rome, Autumn through to Spring (Acts 27.1-28.16)
61-63AD	First Roman captivity for 2 years (Acts 28.30)

<u>Philemon</u> written 61 or 62AD in prison <u>Colossians</u> written 61 or 62AD in prison <u>Ephesians</u> written 61 or 62AD in prison <u>Philippians</u> written 63AD in prison

63-67AD Between the first and second Roman captivities, 4-5 years
